BOOK PROJECT

It Could Have Been Me: Violence, Empathy and Civic Engagement in Mexico

A mixed methods analysis of the relationship between exposure to violence and civic engagement. Based on field research in Mexico, it posits a new theory that explains (a) why exposure to violence provokes some but not all citizens to civic engagement and (b) why some but not all violent events spark such citizen responses.
